Thoughts of Anchors and Safe Harbors

2020 has certainly been a turbulent year. COVID, our nation's ongoing election process, adjustments to how we interact with each other, possibly a loss of confidence in what we hold to be true, and in that we have previously trusted.

Everything seems to be moving fast; to fast. It can be hard to keep up with. The harder we try to keep up with everything that is changing around us, the more frustrating it becomes. Similar to a storm at sea where everything is tossed about and it is difficult to even stand. We could easily loose our footing in these turbulent times. What is concerning to me is that the storm may be just beginning.

While in the service, being able to get to a safe harbor and drop the anchor during a storm was always a blessing. It was not always possible. In the open sea there are no safe harbors, and we had to make do the best we could. In these cases, I can assure you no one is left unchanged. In a storm at sea it is an extreme effort of will power and strength to even move, the noise is deafening, and everything not lashed down securely is thrown about destroying or injuring anything and anyone in its path. It is a life or death situation. A few souls struggle valiantly to keep the ship on a safe course and the engines running, while most can only strap themselves down. Many are sick, many cry out in despair, all pray.

On other occasions our ship was in a position to find safe harbor to anchor. It was at these times I always felt good about the extra care we always gave our anchors and other "ground tackle" and the training of the crew. The ship's safety and lives of her crew depended on it.

Every seaman knows that even in a safe harbor you are not completely protected. On some occasions we needed both our anchors, and even had to keep our engines running on occasion to drive the ship into the wind so as to take the immense strain off the anchors to keep from dragging and running the ship aground. Once in Alaska I was anchored in a remote area called Port Chatham. Our wind speed indicator pegged at 160 mph, where upon it became disabled; but as the saying goes, "Any port in a

storm...". Had we not been able to make Port Chatham the likelihood was that we would have been lost at sea with all hands.

During the many storms where we did find a safe harbor, once the ship was securely anchored, we were able to function in a nearly normal routine and ride the storm out. As any Sea Captain will tell you, keeping the crew in a standard routine is the best way to keep morale up. A standard routine takes your mind off of the tumult going on around you. A routine is familiar and calming. The close of 2020 is one of those times when it would be a good idea to check your anchor to make sure it is in good shape. It would be a good idea to have your safe harbor picked out.

For those purposes, I cannot think of a better anchor then your faith. A strong faith in God and His everlasting love will stand the test of any storm. As for a safe harbor, the best safe harbor I know is going to be family, trusted friends and a good parish. These "safe harbors" will give you focus and provide the oh so familiar "routine" during the turbulence surrounding you. With your anchor properly set in a safe harbor, you will be able to live out the storm that is seemingly approaching.

What will 2021 hold for us? Only God knows. Do not be caught on the open sea. Let your focus be on ensuring your anchor is strong and you have a safe harbor to ride out the storm.
