- 2. Should you avoid receiving Holy Communion on spoon? St. Paul says about communion, "Let each one examine himself." If you believe you are sick, or that you are in danger because of weak health, and you do not receive, I promise you that God will still bless you with His abundance of graces.

Well; things are starting to get hot now. Right on que, Shawn King (the white man that

pretends to be black) comes out to say they need to tear down Jesus religious statues. I read that a Statue of St. Junipero Serra has indeed been tore down in California. I have read that the Catholic Bishops of California failed to condemn the action. They only asked that for this process of tearing down statues "to be truly effective as a remedy for racism, it must discern carefully the entire contribution that the historical figure in question made to American life, especially in advancing the rights of marginalized peoples." If true this is shameful. This is a sign of weakness.

Tearing down religious statues has nothing to do about improving racial relations. This is reminiscent of an old church heresy call iconoclasm, which is the rejection or destruction of religious images as heretical. In the early 700s, there was a group of Christian that believed all religious images should be tore down because they thought

<u>This is not iconoclasm.</u> What is at work here is the first steps of delegitimizing our faith. More and more you will find that it is OK to show their symbols (gay pride flag, BLM signs, graffiti satanic symbols etc..) and it is inappropriate and possibly illegal to show our signs (Cross, Christian symbols, 10 commandments signs etc..)

that other Christians were worshiping the image (statue, icon etc...). Iconoclasm was

condemned by the 2nd council of Nicaea, but rose again during the protestant

reformation. Iconoclasm though was a battle between two Christian sects.

This is a dangerous trend and may progress so that they (ANTIFA, BLM or other groups) will one day come into our churches and disrupt services, desecrate altars. This action if not stopped quickly will eventually lead to killing Christians.

Anyway lets see what the Bishops and Clergy does. As laity we need to be ready to defend what we hold sacred. Remember if you cannot defend what you hold to be sacred you will defend nothing. You will be completely helpless and at the mercy of evil.

Satan knows his time is limited and is throwing everything at us at this moment in an attempt to bring down Christ's church on earth. Remember the vision of Pope Leo
