To Be a Saint

Wisdom! Be attentive! "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge..." Prov-1:7

My last letter dealt with the Biblical theme of listening in the context of our prayer life. In this letter we'll return to that theme, but focus on one of the books of the Old Testament; the Book of Proverbs. For me, the Book of Proverbs along with the Gospel texts, has always been one of those books I can open on short notice, and find treasure immediately. If you remember in the last letter, I wrote we must learn to recognize the voice of God. Well, Proverbs is one of those texts where I can hear God speaking to me directly. It is where I learned to recognize God's voice.

Proverbs properly belongs to a group of books within the Hebrew Bible called Sapiential Books, defined as Hebrew Wisdom Literature. These include The Book of Job, some of the Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Solomon, Wisdom, and Sirach.

Most scholars acknowledge King Solomon as the primary author of Proverbs; however, Proverbs contains wisdom from other writers. Chapter 30 are the words of Agur, son of Jakeh of Massa. Chapter 31 is identified as being written by King Lemuel of Massa containing lessons his mother taught him. Chapters 1-9 serve as an introduction, mostly in the form of a father teaching his son. Chapters 10-29 are identified specifically as the Proverbs of Solomon and then Chapter 30 and 31 conclude with the sayings of Agur and Lemuel.

It is safe to say that Proverbs is a generational accumulation of Hebrew wisdom. Wisdom that is still relevant today. Topics include marriage, work, family, character, forgiveness, generosity, and so much more.

Proverbs contains wisdom that teaches us how to live well in this world. It guides us toward a moral mindset. It teaches us to humble ourselves before the Lord and embrace God's definition of right and wrong, an unchanging value system. A value system that is seemingly being torn asunder in this modern age.

In the church we find the Psalms interwoven in the tapestry of our liturgical life. In a former day, Proverbs were similarly woven into the tapestry of our everyday life. Alas, no more. Moral values are currently in a free fall and have been for many years. Even the very definition of right and wrong are now subject to individual interpretation. An interpretation that changes to best fit circumstances. Even the definition of male and female is being changed, or rather perverted, to fit an agenda. With all that in mind, it is good to have the

anchor of Proverbs and the other biblical works to hold us steadfastly to God. Remember the Bible is God's spoken word to us. God's voice is there if we listen. So, what is God saying to us in Proverbs? Here are three examples pulled at random.

Proverbs 3:5-7: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He will make straight your paths. Be not wise in your own eye's; fear the Lord and turn away from evil."

Proverbs 3:11-12: "My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline or be wary of His reproof, for the Lord reproves him who He loves, as a father the son in whom he delights.

Proverbs 27:1-2: "Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what the day may bring forth. Let another praise you and not your own mouth; a stranger and not your own lips."

This is the wisdom that our ancestors learned and followed. A wisdom that is being largely shunned and ignored by modern society. I believe "cancelled" may be the correct term.

If we long for a return to a clear set of values, then we must turn away from the false wisdom of the world, and return to the Wisdom of God. Starting with yourself, and then your family, especially your children. I recommend opening your Bible occasionally and reading from Proverbs. Yes my friend, there is great treasure there.
