Living with Wooly Bears.

We seemingly are ready to get our information from just about anyone that claims to know, especially sources that we have trusted in the past. Like the wooly bear, we especially like to get our information from those that we tend to agree with.

Right now, there are all shapes and sizes of "Wooly Bears" on the news, social media, in politics, those in Hollywood, pop stars and even sport figures. They claim to know what is going on and why. They also claim to know what we should think about it, and do about it. More importantly these Wooly Bears claim that we should not listen to anyone with a different opinion.

These two-legged Wooly Bears are skilled and persuasive. They present facts in just a certain way that conforms to their own opinion, seeking to make it your opinion. In the final analysis though, what they

are presenting is their opinion only. Unlike their smaller version, these Wooly Bears have an agenda.

There's nothing wrong with coming to a decision on what the weather might be, or what will happen in the future that affects you and your family. It is important that you do, so as to best prepare yourself and your family. There is a responsibility there.

Unless you grew up in a bubble, completely sheltered from reality, you have probably developed a fairly good instinct about what you see going on, and how it will impact you and your loved ones. Don't worry if you see things differently from what the two-legged Wooly Bears are saying. Don't worry if your decision is different from herd instinct. Seek truth, seek reality. God gave you tremendous talent and gifts so that you may take care of yourself and your loved ones. Use them and don't depend on the Wooly Bears.
