To be a Saint - Sacrifice

"I am the Lord your God. Who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before Me." Ex 20:2-3.

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might." Deut. 6:5.

Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind. This is the great and first commandment." Mt 22:37-38.

These are among the passages the Church has used to formulate the First Commandment; "I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me." Yes, another biblical theme, and one of the basic tenants of Christianity. We often hear that God loves us and wants us to be happy, and that is absolutely true; but how often do we hear from the pulpit or elsewhere that God wants us to worship and adore Him; to put nothing else before Him? How do we conduct ourselves with respect to God? Where is our focal point? How lies our heart? Truth be told, we create small and large idols all the time. Idols that take our focus and attention away from the one true God. As a society we are losing sight of God, and replacing Him with our own contrivances.

Adoration always involves some kind of recognition of the absolute supremacy of God, and of our total dependence on him. One of the most fundamental types of adoration is sacrifice; an idea that is often misunderstood, and frankly is not popular or promoted in today's society.

In his Spiritual Exercises, St. Ignatius Loyola said that love is shown more in deeds than in words. When we pray and declare our love for God, is that where it ends? Let me ask you some questions. For those who are married, when you told your spouse that you loved her, is that where you left it? Did you not show your love in some way other than in words? Did you not make sacrifices to demonstrate your love? For older married couples, have you not made sacrifice throughout your marriage to take care of your spouse and family, further demonstrating your love and devotion? Of course, the answer to these questions is a resounding yes! So, should there not be an even greater show of devotion to our Creator? The one we acknowledge as the one true God? Or do we make sacrifice to other gods? The gods of pleasure and vice. The gods of wealth and possessions.

Every aspect of human existence requires us to make sacrifices. Educational pursuits, sports, careers, marriage and family, all require us to make sacrifice. There are certain things that we have to give up, that we deny ourselves, in order to be successful. It follows that being a Christian would also require sacrifice.

Love must be free; it cannot be forced and it cannot be bought. No one can force you to sacrifice for the sake of love. A religious sacrifice must be freely given to God as a sign of love, of reverence and submission to him. Such sacrifices are very meritorious in the sight of God, because they are acts of love. That is what God wants from us more than anything else, love.

Sacrifices come in many different forms: fasting, penances of various kinds, controlling vain curiosity, giving up a little social life to visit the church to pray, or help someone in need. Offering up your pains and sufferings, all the while handling them with grace and dignity. Even giving up sweets on occasion is a sacrifice. Yes, this is very pleasing to God. Careful though, in and of itself, getting up to go to church on Sunday is a requirement, not a sacrifice.

If you are familiar with the life of any saint, you will know what I am talking about. For there has never been a saint who did not practice some kind of sacrificial self-denial for love of God.
