Put yourself and your family in the Hands of God

“Well Dad, I’m officially out of patience with my family. Even the dogs have to go.”

“I suspect you’re just having a bad day, but you bring up a good point. You know what Einstein said?”

“No I don’t Dad, but I’m sure you’re going to tell me.”

Albert Einstein once remarked that God does not play dice with the universe. Einstein saw a certain structure and order to the universe that could have only been accomplished by a supreme creator. As Christians, we know this to be true. God extends his love and order to each of His creations. If God does not play dice with the universe, He certainly would not do so to us, who are created in His image. God has a plan for us.

God puts people in our life for various reasons, to bless us, to guide us, to help us accomplish some good. I believe that Satan does the same thing but for very different reasons, Satan puts people and influencers in our life to distract us, to influence us away from God, and so on.

Not all marriages are blessed. From what I can tell your family has been. From the children He has given you, to the way you each take care of the other during sickness, to the joy you have in doing little things as a family. These are undeniable indicators of God’s blessing.

“Not feeling very blessed right now Dad.”

Anyway, those we love the most often become the ones we fight with the most. From my experience most of those fights start over something inconsequential. They start a lot of times when we are tired or stressed out about something not even related to the family. A cross word here and there, a selfish action or sense of entitlement, well, these little pricks to the skin, over time, evolve into mental knife wounds. We become masters of the verbal skirmish when we need to become masters of

humility and peace. In the turbulent family emotion that ensues we lose sight of God’s blessing. Indeed, I have good reason to believe that we can lose God’s blessing.

When we see these things happening, take a step back. It takes great strength, great love and a very strong sense of sacrifice and humility to weather those times.

Which brings me back to God’s plan. Each member of your family is a gift from God. A gift that serves to put purpose in your life, and develop you. God, in His wisdom, gives to you those who bring you gladness and joy, but at the same time also tests you. It is in the test that we are tempered and evolve into a better person.

If we live according to God’s plan for the family, each member of the family will be changed for the better. Instead of the self-centered, self-gratifying physical desires of individual members of a family, a family living under God’s plan are apt to be focused on sharing, helping out, concerned more about the other members of the family than they are about themselves. They overall show a sense of humility and yes even submission, according to the role of each member. These are common traits of good God-fearing families.

Seek God’s help and guidance. Be careful of your own council, it will fail you. God often allows pressure in our life to bring us to a greater trust in Him. Bring your problems and frustrations then to God. When you do this, seek to do it as a family. For it is the family that is in ultimate risk. When you come together as a family for God’s aid, do so not in an emotional once and for all show down, but in the routine course of daily life. Do so with loving persistence. God, the Father to us all, will answer your family’s prayer.

Ask God for His council and blessing. Ask God for patience and humility. Ask for the grace to be a better wife, husband, son and daughter.

CARMEN EDWARDS OBITUARY

Beloved wife, mother, grandmother, aunt, and daughter, Carmen Angelika (Cassatt) Edwards journeyed to be with our Lord on June 20, 2022 after losing a valiant fight against glioblastoma brain cancer.

She was born in Mannheim, Germany on October 28, 1954, the daughter of SFC Ralph R. Cassatt, U.S. Army, and Anneliese Therese (Steinlein) Cassatt. Due to her father's military career with back-to-back tours in Europe, her early childhood was spent in Germany where she became very close to her grandmother, Emilie Steinlein, and enjoyed time on the family's country farm.

She attended preschool and kindergarten in the local German community and grew up speaking both English and German. At age 6, she came to the United States for the first time and became immersed in American culture, a big change from the German farm she spent so much time on. But she would return to Germany over the years due to her father's multiple Germany assignments, and graduated valedictorian in 1972 from Kaiserslautern American High School, part of the Department of Defense Overseas Schools network in Kaiserslautern, Germany.

She attended and graduated from The Pennsylvania State University, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Pre-Med at the main campus in State College, Pennsylvania in 1976. She married her college sweetheart, Leonard R. Edwards, Jr., in May 1976 in El Paso, Texas where her parents had retired. She then spent the next several years working as a German and French translator for a family-owned stringed instrument replacement company in Ann Arbor, Michigan with global customers.

In 1979, when Leonard joined the United States Air Force, she then spent the next twenty-eight years supporting his career and raising their two sons as the family traveled across the United States and Germany for various military assignments. The family spent eight years in Germany, where she worked as a teacher's aide in the American schools in Geilenkirchen and Landstuhl, Germany, where she could be close to the boys. She also enjoyed traveling and did many trips with her friends to most of the countries in western Europe.

When the family returned to the United States in 1992 with an assignment to

Albuquerque, New Mexico, she continued to be the chief homemaker and caretaker of her sons. Then in 1994, she realized that as high school teenagers, the boys no longer needed so much caretaking, so she chose to pursue further study. She decided she didn't want to pursue training to become a doctor because of the time it would take, but she did want to have something to do in the medical field. She attended, and graduated from, the University of New Mexico School of Medicine Allied Health Sciences with a certification as a Diagnostic Medical Sonographer in 1995. As the family continued to move within the United States, she worked as an Ultrasonographer for the next twenty-six years in New Mexico, Oklahoma, Virginia, and Colorado. She retired in 2021 from Penrad Imaging in Colorado Springs, Colorado and was ready to travel when the COVID-19 pandemic shut down most of the world, and the brain cancer diagnosis changed the future.

She was preceded in death by her father, Ralph Cassatt.

She is survived by her husband of forty-six years, Leonard; sons, Christopher (Ruth Ewell) Edwards of Lafayette, Colorado, Matthew (Lisa Cifrulak) Edwards of Williamsburg, Virginia; mother, Anneliese Cassatt of El Paso, Texas; sister, Connie Cassatt of El Paso, Texas; and grandson, Benjamin of Lafayette, Colorado.

Nothing but a Number

Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. Naval officer Grace Hopper became the first female rear admiral of the United States Navy when she was 79. Margaret Haggerty completed her quest to run a marathon on each of the seven continents when she was 84.

If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is “ultra-experienced adults.” God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
