Who we are

"Grandpa, you and Grandma have a lot of statues and pictures of Saints in your house and outside."

"Well, that's right Eva, so do you, at your home."

"Ya, your right grandpa, why is that?"

"Well, those statues, crosses and icons remind us who we are, and what God wants us to be. They help guide us, give us strength and yes, protect us. They also tell others that Christians live here."

It's always interested me how people like to mark themselves, their things, and places with symbols and other graffiti, that more or less identify who they are, what they stand for or believe. It's common in one form or another to every culture, and in every country, and goes back to the beginning of time. Read Gn-4:15 and we see that after killing Able, Cain was given a mark by God that protected him. It's no secret that mankind has a need to express themselves through signs, symbols and art.

We still see graffiti and art work from ancient days. There is graffiti to be found in the pyramids of Egypt, and the Great Wall of China. We see the graffiti and symbols of ancient Rome and other ancient cities, including signs, symbols and art work of first century Christians. Even today, walking through towns in Italy and many other European countries, you can find little shines to Christ, the Blessed Virgin, or some Saint, placed in a small alcove in the wall outside of private homes. These beautiful little professions of faith loudly proclaim, "Here lives a Christian".

I remember growing up, you could always tell you were in a Christian household when you first came into the home. There would be a cross, or a statue prominently placed as you came into the front door. In some homes there would even be a small bowl hanging on the wall with holy water, placed next to a statue or cross. Some families would have a religious statue in their front lawn. You could drive through a small community and get a fairly good feel of their outward profession of faith in God just by looking at how they marked their homes and community. Not so much these days.

I do not see that same outward expression of faith in public today. Praying in public before a meal, or other public prayer, and marks of Christian life are rare. If religious symbols are worn in public, it is often worn as costume jewelry

with a lack of reverence. Our Christian Faith, in general, has been downplayed in our society.

We have sanitized our public schools of everything having to do with Christian faith. The same thing is true in most public places. In fact, anyone choosing to openly display their Christian belief in public is normally scorned, ridiculed, if not fined, for daring to display their faith in public. Antagonists vocally point out the hypocrisy of a few "Christians" that show these outward professions of faith, yet live a worldly, sinful lifestyle, trying to associate all Christians who profess their faith openly with the hypocrites. This is an old game, but effective at causing others to hide their faith.

What I do see happening today is the rise of non-Christian symbols, art and graffiti. Things that celebrate worldly pleasure and the perverse. I see more and more symbols that declare the unholy, the satanic.

Our children grow up seeing this and whether they know it or not, they are influenced a great deal by it. What child does not know the logo of their favorite fast-food restaurant? Yes, there is an influence here that marks them for life. What must it tell a child when they see a pentagram saying that Satan loves them? Let them rather see icons and statues of Saints. Let them hear the gospel stories and learn their faith. Quickly now; before the world shows them another way.

Nothing but a Number

Japanese mountain climber Yuichiro Miura reached the summit of Mount Everest at age 70. George Brunstad was also 70 when he swam the English Channel. If stories like these teach us anything, it's that senior adults are capable of amazing things.

That was certainly true of Joshua. Even though he was probably nearing the century mark, God had a plan for him. Age didn't matter to God. Rather than telling Joshua to rest, retire or step aside for a younger replacement, God instructed him to get to work.

Perhaps we should take a cue from God in our attitude toward older adults. From an early age most of us were taught to respect our elders. However, too often we confuse politeness for respect. What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.

In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.

Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?
