## To Be a Saint – The Seven Signs of John - Part 5, Walking on Water.

This week we will resume our study of the seven signs that Christ worked in the Gospel of John, with Jesus walking on the Water, John 6:16-21. The miracle is also recorded in the Gospel of Matthew 14:22-33, and Mark 6:45-51. It is worth your time to review all three accounts.

Prelude. This miracle was performed in the early hours on the day after the feeding of the 5000. As you recall, Jesus had slipped away from the marveling crowd who wanted to seize Him and make Him their King. He went into the hills to pray to Himself and instructed His disciples to cross the Sea of Galilee. They departed the eastern shore about dusk back toward Capernaum, according to John. Jesus was not with them. We read in Matthew that a great wind arose and the wind was against them, meaning that it was blowing opposite from the direction they were travelling.

The Sea of Galilee lies within the Jordan Valley in a mountain range that rises to 4,000 feet above sea level. The lake itself is 700 feet below sea level. The geography makes this body of water greatly susceptible to sudden and extremely violent storms caused by the cold air rushing down from the mountains surrounding it and colliding with the warm, moist air rising off the surface of the water itself. As the body of water was relatively small the waves developed during storms are short and steep. A particularly dangerous situation for those in a small sailing vessel.

According to John, the disciples had rowed against the wind, and were 3 or 4 miles from the coast when the seas began to rise. Most of Jesus' disciples were fishermen and had spent many years on this water. This may account for the fact that the boat was kept from immediately foundering in the storm. The key to safety was to use the boat's rudder and oars to keep the bow, the structurally strongest part of the boat, into the wind and into the seas. A physically difficult undertaking. Especially as it was dark. Changing course and traveling back to where they had departed would have been very dangerous. The maneuver would have exposed their beam at one point directly to the ongoing seas, where they could be capsized. If they survived the course

change, their stern would have been exposed to the waves, and their rudder would have been relatively ineffective at maintaining a course. Assuming their sail could withstand the wind, which was doubtful, they would have had to set sail immediately, and come quickly to a comparative speed of the waves, so that the rudder would become useful again. Until then, their stern would be pushed one way or another exposing the beam again to the seas, or the stern would be simply swamped with water. Mark records the time as during the 4<sup>th</sup> watch. Sometime between 3am and 6am. A time when exhausted men's spirits are weak and courage wanes. The situation was desperate.

The Sign - Mark records that from His hilltop on land, Jesus saw that the disciples were in trouble. Once again, we see the compassion of Jesus as He comes to their aid. It is here that John says the disciples saw Jesus walking on the water coming toward them. According to Matthew, at first, they thought it was a ghost and were afraid. Jesus immediately calmed them and said, "It is I, do not be afraid". John, an eye witness to the event, said the disciples were glad to take Him into the boat and that the seas were immediately calmed.

How? How had the disciples seen Jesus approaching in the darkness of the 4<sup>th</sup> watch in the midst of a storm? How had Jesus been able to communicate with the disciples to calm them, when the winds were so fierce? How had Jesus been able to walk the water? In the third sign of John, we see clearly that Jesus is not subject to the laws of the Sabbath. Here we see just as clearly He is also not subject to the laws of nature, of physics, of time. All these and more are subject to God alone, their Creator, and through Him the Son of God.

Even more, in Matthew we hear the wonderful story of Peter asking Jesus, "...that if it is you Lord, command me that I might come to you." Upon calling him, Peter got out of the boat and indeed walked on water for a short distance until he became distracted and turned his eyes from Jesus, whereupon he immediately started to go under. Jesus rescues him from the water, saying to him, "Oh you of little faith. Why did you doubt?" Here we see that through Jesus we may also come to Him regardless of the circumstances. It is only when we become distracted that we are overcome. If only we have the faith of Peter when he got out of the boat.

It is here, this specific event, that many scholars feel that there was no longer any doubt in the disciples' minds that Jesus was indeed the Son of God. They not only accepted Jesus gladly into their boat but into their hearts.

What's the difference? Politeness might include offering a hand to senior adults when they struggle with steps or making awkward small talk with aging relatives at family gatherings. Respect, however, would include realizing that with their years of challenges and experiences these adults are a rich, God-given resource.*

*In this age of politically correct labels, perhaps a better name for senior citizens is "ultra-experienced adults." God entrusted Joshua with an important duty a quarter century after Joshua reached retirement age because of his vast military experience and knowledge.*

*Think of the older adults you know. How does God want to use them in your life? What experiences of theirs might benefit you? What life lessons have they learned that might keep you from making a bad decision? And what might you be able to learn from hearing their stories and asking for their advice?*
