Our Daily Bread – That’s a Good Christmas

Rugged, miserable, bleak; words not normally associated with Christmas, yet as I sit here writing on a wet December day, surrounded by comfort, I drift back to reminisce about several Christmas’s long ago.

There was the one spent in a shipyard. Most of the married crew managed to travel home, and it was the single guys who stayed behind that Christmas. Anyone who has been to a shipyard will probably remember the sand blast grit. It gets into everything. There is also a greasy film on everything, and it leaves you feeling dirty all the time. It was a dreary atmosphere, inadequate heating, communal showers without hot water, I won’t mention the toilet situation. The one bright spot was the food. It was contracted out, and we had three hot meals a day provided. Meat loaf for Christmas Eve, and turkey with all the trimmings on Christmas day. Now that was a good Christmas.

Then there was the Christmas we spent breaking ice on the Hudson River. There was more of a purpose for that, as nearly all homes in the Hudson valley depended on fuel oil for heat, and the barges that transported it. All shipping was at a standstill, stuck in the ice. We ran convoys from West Point to just below Albany. Up and down the ice choked river around the clock. The wind was bad, with record low temperatures. I honestly do not remember being warm for the two plus weeks we ran that operation. In the end though we felt really good about what we had accomplished, and that was another good Christmas.

Then there was the Christmas Eve spent on the pier in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico. Due to a string of failures, the ship’s A/C system was completely out. The heat inside the ship was awful. We got permission to pull off our patrol and moor in Mayaguez, as the spare parts we had flown in was supposedly on the pier waiting for us. We tied up to the pier just before midnight on Christmas Eve, only to find the place shut down and locked up. We stayed right there, and slept out on the pier with that cool breeze blowing in from the Mona Pass. There were over 100 of us sitting against the security fence running the length of the pier. Somehow or other a bottle of something was being passed around, and Christmas carols broke out as the time approach midnight. That was another good Christmas.

Then there was the time in the north Pacific. That was a bad storm. In any other part of the world, they give a name to storms like that and write stories. In that area extending up into Alaska they are just called lows. It came upon us Christmas Eve. We were waiting to recover our helicopter from patrol. Watching the weather deteriorate, I remembered I had

met my first North Pacific low some 25 years earlier, when operating a patrol boat around Kodiak.

That storm developed quickly and decimated the local fishing fleet. We came into Kodiak after 72 hours of non-stop operations. Beat up, torn apart, yet still alive, most of us went first to the laundry and then across the street to the old fisherman’s bar. It was a couple days before Christmas. The bar was typical, concrete floor, a couple of heaters and a potbellied stove burning cherry red. A single sting of preposterous blinking Christmas lights above the bar, a juke box playing, and it was packed with other survivors of that storm. To top it off it was happy hour, which back in those days included a crock pot full of ham and beans. I soaked in the atmosphere and remember it felt so good just to be alive. The waitress brought me a bowl of beans, and knowing what we had just been through said, “Now that’s a good Christmas”. And it was.

Fast forward twenty-five years and the Christmas Eve storm I was watching develop from the bridge of my ship. The weather had shifted far earlier than the predictions. I knew full well what was coming. We were making best speed to intercept and recover our helicopter and crew of 4 souls. So far away from the rest of the world, there was literally no place else for our bird to land. As they approached, we made a sharp turn into the seas, timed so that we would not broach the ship in the process. When on course to recover, our flight deck was well outside of safety parameters. Talking to the pilot, we made the best arrangements possible. I managed to get us on top of a gigantic swell and cut back the engines briefly, to allow us to linger a bit. This gave us a steady flight deck for a few seconds. We gave clearance for the landing, and the experienced pilot immediately dropped on the deck, engaging the talon hook into the grid as accurately and as quickly as an eagle would swoop down and catch a fish. He then shut down the helicopter, and we made another dicey turn of the ship down swell to provide a smoother ride to put our bird in the hanger. I later met the pilot coming out of the debrief in avionics. Normally stoic in all situations, this time he looked very haggard and happy to be alive. He smiled broadly when he saw me and said, “Good to be home skipper”. I replied, “And that’s a good Christmas”.

I could go on, but you see I never really had a bad Christmas. Play the hand you are dealt and make the most of it. Doing this, I suspect you will never have one either.
