Our Daily Bread – Legends of Saint Nicholas

In seeking the perfect Christmas, we spend far too much time caught up in the modern hustle and bustle of Christmas shopping and secular preparation, and not enough on the quality time necessary to make those memories we want so much. The best Christmas' are heavy on intimate family moments. Seldom used today, storytelling was a big part of the season in olden times. It built family unity, and passed along values and traditions. So, turn off the distractions, dim the lights, gather the family around your advent wreath or nativity scene, and tell a story or two. I'll give to you a few stories, perhaps legends, based on the historical figure of Saint Nicholas of Myra...

How did Saint Nicholas become Santa Claus?

The most famous story about Saint Nicholas involves a man with three daughters. The family was poor, and the young girls were in danger of being forced into slavery, because their father could not afford to offer a suitable dowry for them to be married. One night, Nicholas went to the family's home, and threw a bag of coins through the open window, then fled before he could be seen. With the money, the father was able to arrange a marriage for his eldest daughter. Nicholas returned twice more, always at night so that he could not be identified. But the third time, the father rushed out of the house to identify their benefactor. Nicholas begged him not to tell anyone what he had done.

Saint Nicholas becomes the patron of seamen...

When he was a young man, Nicholas boarded a ship to take him on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Following in the footsteps of the Lord, Nicholas prayed that he might be able to experience more fully the closeness of Jesus, and share in His sufferings. Returning to Greece, a dangerous storm arose, and his ship was in danger of sinking. Nicholas calmly prayed, and suddenly the wind ceased and the waves died down, to the wonder of the sailors. From that time on, seaman invoke the name of Saint Nicholas to protect them at sea.

Saint Nicholas sent to prison!

Emperor Constantine convened the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. This was the very first Ecumenical Council, where more than 300 bishops came from all over the Christian world to debate the nature of the Holy Trinity, and many other things pertaining to the faith. It was an intense time as Bishop Arius from Egypt had spread a false doctrine that Christ was not truly God. Arius forcefully argued his position at length, and indeed had many allies in the council. The bishops listened to Arius respectfully. All except for one. According to Theodore the Lector, who wrote in detail of the council, Saint Nicholas was among the bishops that attended. It was Saint Nicholas who finally stood up to Arius.

As Arius vigorously preached heresy, Nicholas became more and more agitated. Finally, he could no longer bear what he believed was blasphemy about the nature of Christ. The outraged Nicholas stood up, crossed the room, and slapped Arius across the face! The bishops were shocked. It was unbelievable that a bishop would lose control and be so hotheaded in such a solemn assembly. According to legend, the council brought Nicholas to the Emperor. Constantine left the decision to the bishops, many of whom were allies of Arius. The bishops decided to strip Nicholas of

his bishop's garments, chained him, and threw him into jail. That would keep Nicholas away from the meeting. When the Council ended, a final decision would be made about his future.

Nicholas was ashamed and prayed for forgiveness, though he did not waver in his belief. During the night, Jesus and Mary appeared to Nicholas. They asked, "Why are you in jail?" Nicholas replied, "Because of my love for you". Jesus then gave the book of the Gospels to Nicholas. Mary gave him a bishop's omophorion, which is a vestment worn around the neck like a scarf. If you look at the icon of Saint Nicholas today, you will see it clearly around the Saint's neck. Once again at peace, Nicholas studied the Scriptures for the rest of the night.

When the jailer came in the morning, he found the chains loose on the floor and Nicholas dressed in a bishop's omophorion, quietly reading the Scriptures. When Constantine was told of this, the emperor asked that Nicholas be freed. Nicholas was then fully reinstated as the Bishop of Myra.

Returned to the council, Nicholas spoke against Arius and showed how the Trinity could be three, yet one. He held up a brick and said that while it was made of earth, water, and fire, it still was one brick, just as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are one God. As he held the brick, it burst into flame, drops of water fell to the ground, until all that remained was a handful of dry dust. Faced with this miracle, the Council of Nicaea agreed with Nicholas' views, deciding the question against Arius, and producing the Nicene Creed which we repeat at every mass and every Divine Liturgy. So you see, in a way we have Saint Nicholas to thank for this very important gift of our Nicene Creed.

The Council of Nicaea also gave us the canon of Holy Scripture. The one we still use today. Up until that time, there were many so called gospels. Some of which were clearly fake and meant to mislead the faithful. Did the text of the Gospels that Christ gave Nicholas in his cell that night, form the four Gospels we use today?

But that's another story...
