**4. Trust God to Bring Justice**

Ecclesiastes 12:14 says, "For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil."

God brings every action into his judgment. There are no secrets in his world. That allows us to relinquish our right to exact our judgment on those we see as manipulating situations unfairly. We must trust God to right the wrongs that happen in our world.

Matthew 7:1-2 says, "Judge not, that you be not judged. You will be judged by the judgment you pronounce, and with the measure you use, it will be measured by you."

The Bible also warns that when we take matters into our own hands, we will feel the wrath of his judgment. God says we must not pridefully take matters into our own hands. We must prayerfully trust him to guide our steps so we can show love and protect our hearts simultaneously. This can only be accomplished with the supernatural help of God's Holy Spirit.

**Parking Lot Replacement Fundraiser** - Our parking lot is in a terrible state. There is one section in front of the church hall that is actually leeching dirt from the subsurface during heavy rains. At best that area is a tripping hazard; at worst, continued erosion will one day create a terrible sinkhole. Other sections of the parking lot are so weak that leaf blowers will actually blow away rotten asphalt. We've done sealing repairs twice over the last few years, but that no longer remains a viable option. We need a new parking lot.

The Plan..... Estimates are being gathered, but the simple fact is we do not have the amount of money required to contract the job out. As those numbers come together, we will make it known, but the cost could be in excess of \$75K-\$100K. In the interim, the parish plans to install a professional asphalt repair in the area in front of the hall, where the subsoil is leeching through. The cost of the repair is something the parish can afford now, while buying us needed time..... In that time Ascension will be conducting a fund raiser to install the new parking lot. Details will be announced soon. Father Alex.

## To Be a Saint – The Didache

How was the early church establish? How did it become the Catholic institution that it is today with so many traditions, yet all traditions in unity? Yes, the Apostles spread the truth of Jesus Christ, but remember they could not reach out to no more than a gathering of people at a time. As we see in the Acts of the Apostles, there were many imposters and charlatans seeking opportunity and spreading error wherever they went. Saint Paul's letters were primarily letters of guidance and correction to churches that had fallen into error. In its early days "the church" was more of a freewheeling and charismatic movement, poised to go in a thousand directions, all false, but one.

What to do? It was the Holy Spirit that clearly guided the Church. As we see in the Acts of the Apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter and the others were able to speak in languages readily understood by the multi-lingual crowd in Jerusalem on that Pentecost. But it would take more than words though to hold this new movement together as it spread. It would take clear written instruction to maintain unity and conformity. Again, it was the Holy Spirit that guided the Apostles and Church Fathers not only in what they said, but what they wrote. As Paul put it; *So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter. 2 Thes. 2:15*

Even before the Gospel texts were completed, and long before the Bible took its final form, the Apostles Creed stood as the bedrock of Catholic belief. Some early writers, Saint Ambrose and the philosopher monk Rufinus are two, maintain that it was composed under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, with each of the Apostles contributing one of twelve articles.

But there are other manuscripts containing early church teaching that was essential in keeping the faith true. In this letter we will discuss the Didache. The Didache (Did-uh-kay), a Greek word for teaching, was originally written in Greek, was developed in the late 1<sup>st</sup> Century. If the Creed was a list of Catholic beliefs, then the Didache was more than likely the first manual of instruction and practice.

The Didache's full name is, "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles". Some believe that the *Didache* was written for an early Christian community comprised of Jewish converts and gentiles, living in and around Antioch. The Didache relies heavily on the Gospel of Matthew, which was written a few years before. Could there be a greater connection between the two writings? I suppose we will never know.

The first of the Didache's two distinct parts is a series of admonitions related to "the two ways, one of life and one of death." The way of life is this: "first, you shall love God who made you; second, love your neighbor as yourself." This is elaborated through a short manual of moral instruction, drawn largely from the Ten Commandments and Matthew's Sermon on the Mount.

In contrast, "The way of death", includes a detailed catalog of specific vices, e.g. "the way of persecutors of good people, of those hating truth, of those having no mercy for the poor, not working on behalf of the oppressed, not knowing Him who made them."

Ho Hum, no big deal you say? Remember the Bible as we know it did not exist then. These Christian concepts are very familiar to us in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. They were unknown and revolutionary to those living two thousand years ago.

The second part of The Didache affirms our current liturgical rites and practices through a description of their original form. Let's take a glimpse. There is a detailed instruction on how to conduct

Baptisms. An excerpt; "... *Give public instruction on all these points, and then baptize in running water, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. If you do not have running water, baptize in some other. If you cannot in cold, then in warm. If you have neither, then pour water on the head three times in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.....*" Among other things you will find in the second part of the Didache is the Lord's Prayer, early Eucharistic prayers, the concept of fasting on Wednesdays and Fridays, and much more.

Church organization was in an early stage of development. We hear of "itinerant apostles and prophets", serving as "chief priests" and possibly celebrating the Eucharist; meanwhile, we see the developing importance of bishops and deacons, who also have authority, and are seemingly beginning to take the place of the itinerant ministry. There is also advice about how to detect false teachers.

The Didache concludes with a warning that believers should remain vigilant and prepared for the Lord's return. A theme we continue even today. So then, when we worship in our chosen Catholic tradition, remember that tradition was forged mainly by that generation which were contemporaries of Christ, and guided by the Holy Spirit.
