## To be a Saint – Pre-Lenten Preparation

In the parable of the ten virgins, Jesus illustrates the necessity of spiritual readiness. Five wise virgins prepared by bringing extra oil for their lamps, while the foolish ones did not. When the bridegroom arrived, only the prepared virgins were able to enter the wedding feast. Mt. 25:1-13.

This letter will focus on the pre-Lenten preparation in the two rites I am most familiar with, one of those will focus on the extraordinary form of the Latin Rite, the other will be the Byzantine Ruthenian Rite of the Eastern Church.

In the West the pre-Lenten traditions have undergone radical change over the last century, due to the reforms of Vatican II. Prior to those reforms though, there were three weeks of preparation before the beginning of Lent, called the Septuagesimal season. It includes the three Sundays before Ash Wednesday; Septuagesima, Sexagesima and Quinquagesima. Changes to the Latin rite liturgical calendar made in 1969, removed the Septuagesimal season entirely. However, traditional Roman Rite Catholics still celebrate them in what is known as the extraordinary form of the Latin Rite. Let's follow that tradition.

Septuagesima Sunday reminds the faithful of the consequences of sin. From the Divine Office we hear the story of the fall of Adam, and the Gospel reminds us that we must labor in the vineyard of the Lord to obtain our heavenly reward. On Sexagesima Sunday we hear the parable of the Sower and the Seed. The seed (the Word of God) bears fruit when it is accepted, and fails when it is ignored or neglected. On Quinquagesima Sunday we are called to charity in Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians 13:1-13. Then we read in the Gospel of Luke, as Jesus describes His passion and resurrection, Luke 18:31-43. In this we are called to develop an unshakable faith in God's plan of salvation as Lent comes upon us.

The Septuagesimal season was to help people transition from the Christmas season, and prepare spiritually for Lent. Liturgically, the Mass looks and feels very much like Lent. The Gloria and Alleluia are not said until Easter, the tone is very penitential, with the priest wearing purple vestments. The main difference would be that there were no fasting requirements during this pre-Lenten period.

Why the change in 1969? The 1963 Vatican II document, Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, called for the Liturgical Year to be revised. Pope Saint Paul VI approved the revised calendar in 1969, which omitted the Septuagesimal period. The commentary accompanying the change explains; "...The season of Septuagesima is abolished since it had no meaning of its own.... It was difficult to explain the season to the people, and even the names of its Sundays were obscure. Most of all, it took away from the 'newness' of the penitence theme, proper to the liturgy of Lent" (Regan, *Advent to Pentecost: Comparing the Seasons in the Ordinary and Extraordinary Forms of the Roman Rite*, p. 77-78). The Eastern Churches were not touched by Vatican II, and were allowed, even encouraged, to maintain their traditions in the Vatican II document entitled *Orientalium Ecclesiarum* (Of the Eastern Churches).

Let's turn then to the Byzantine Ruthenian Rite. The pre-Lenten period runs from the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee, four weeks prior to Clean Monday, and the beginning of Lent in the Eastern Church.

As with the extraordinary rite of the Roman Catholic church, the Byzantine Rite uses this time to effect

a change from the joyous mood of the Christmas season into the more serious mood of Lent. It is presented in a systematic fashion.

From the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee, we are told to put away our pride and develop humility. We then transition to the Sunday of the Prodigal Son, a time when we are called to recognize our sins and repent of them.

The following Sunday is called Meat Fare Sunday. On this Sunday we are presented with the Last Judgement. For those who might have missed the call for repentance presented in the story of the Prodigal Son, the story of the Last Judgement and the eternal damnation that awaits those who do not repent, provides one last reminder. This Sunday also begins a fast from meat products.

The Sunday immediately preceding Lent is called Cheese Fare Sunday, or Forgiveness Sunday. Assuming we have repented our sins, we are now invited to ask forgiveness from others for any offenses we have committed, and instructed to forgive others their sins against us. This also begins another phase of the fast which includes dairy products.

Other Rites have their own traditions, each of which are beautiful and instructive. One thing they all have in common is the theme of preparation. Like the five wise virgins, we prepare to walk the way of the cross with our Lord during the Lenten season.
