To Be a Saint – President Biden, Catholic and Freemason?

On the day before President Biden left office, he accepted membership in the “Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of South Carolina, for his “exceptional dedication and service to the United States”. Think what you will about his service to the United States, be it good or bad, President Biden is a self-professed, confirmed Catholic, and there is a problem there regarding Masonic membership.

As many of you know, I address the Lodges once or twice a year, and for good reason, which we will touch upon within this letter. But first things first Is Joe Biden now a Freemason? It would appear so, as he freely accepted the membership. As a Catholic he should have politely turned it down.

First some history. Many think the Lodge is a very old institution dating back to biblical times. In fact, the current version of the Lodge dates back to the founding of the first Lodge in a London pub in 1717. Many Catholics joined. Freemasonry professes to be religiously tolerant, but the lodges became a center for heresy and gnostic philosophy.

In 1832, Pope Gregory XVI condemned the Free Masons as promoting what he called Religious Indifferentism. A term we have discussed before. In brief, it is the belief that it does not matter what religion a man professes; he can be saved no matter his faith. The Church has roundly condemned this notion.

As Masonry spread across Europe, the papal condemnations kept coming, and eight popes issued encyclicals or papal bulls imposing a penalty of automatic excommunication on any Catholic who joined the Freemasons, this was codified in the promulgation of the first Code of Canon Law in 1917, under Pope Clement XII.

At its peak in America during the 1950s, Freemason Lodges claimed to have had 4.1 million members. Why not, it seems harmless enough, fraternity, charitable outreach and so on. It seems like a benign social club. Consider for a moment, most everything Satan is associated with, starts off as seeming reasonable and non-threatening.....

In 1983 the church issued the Declarations on Masonic Associations, approved by Saint Pope John Paul II. The Declaration re-iterated the prohibition of Catholics from joining Masonic Lodges. The document states that Catholics who join Masonic organizations are in a state of grave sin and may not receive Holy Communion. It was issued by then Joseph Cardinal John Ratzinger, later to become Pope Benedict XVI.

What about excommunication? Excommunication and being in a state of grave sin do not go hand in hand. It depends on the local ordinary exercising jurisdiction. In any case, being in a state of mortal sin is serious, given that one who does not repent of such wrongdoing will go to hell. (CCC1861).

Many others have warned of the dangers of the Lodges. St. Maximilian Kolbe founded his Militia of the Immaculata to combat the Masons, after he observed them proclaiming in 1917 during their Masonic bicentennial celebration in Rome; “Satan must reign in the Vatican. The pope will be his slave.” Similarly, Blessed Father Michael McGivney, established the Knights of Columbus in 1882, in part to provide a fraternal alternative to the Lodge for Catholic men. So, why does the Catholic Church forbid Catholic men to become Freemasons?

Masons view God as “the Great Architect,” hence their use of emblems of the architects’ basic tools. Its rituals contain images and language inspired by the medieval stonemason guilds

that used apprenticed workers to cut stones. It is a secret society whose belief system is a form of Gnosticism, which aligns with the Arian heresy, because it was Arius who imagined that Jesus was a great architect of the universe, while also denying Christ’s divinity. Masonry is a proponent of human reasoning that tries to imagine a god, whereas our God is found in the revelation of Christ Jesus. In its lower grades it appears as a naturalistic thought process. According to former lodge members who have since rejected Freemasonry, in its higher levels the “Supreme Being” is gradually identified as Satan.

So, what will happen with former President Biden? He may feel the membership will be seen as something honorary only; little pursued, and no big deal to him. In the end God will be the judge of all. As the second Catholic President though, there is an example set. In this case the church should make a statement reiterating their stance on Freemasonry.

For further review I recommend reading the Permanent Instruction of the Alta Vendita, a Masonic blueprint for the subversion of the Catholic Church.
