Instead of worrying about your challenges, you train your mind to focus on God and the excellent work God is doing. This fresh perspective can significantly strengthen your mental health. So, [pay attention to God’s wonder every day](#). The more you do so, the more your mind will be refreshed.

There is so much wonder around you that finding it will be easy once you pay attention.

[Psalm 65:8](#) states: “The whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders; where morning dawns, where evening fades, you call forth songs of joy.”

One compelling way to discover God’s wonder is by exploring God’s creation. [Every part of nature reveals something remarkable about God](#), who created it. When life feels overwhelming, step outside and immerse yourself in nature. That can help you see beyond your immediate struggles.

Seeing how vast the sky is, admiring the details of a beautiful flower, or enjoying the sound of birds singing can all remind you that a good God is in control. Recognizing God’s presence in creation shows that he is both powerful and personal. God’s wonder isn’t limited to nature. You can find it in people, art, science, music, and more. Finding and enjoying God’s wonder in the world around you will inspire you with the hope that it will boost your mental health.

Our Daily Bread – As Father’s Day Approaches

Official government drivel from the Institute of Health (NIH) states – *“Traditional masculinity is considered as the negative and socially aversive traits and behaviors related to idealized societal masculine norms, and is characterized by instrumental personality traits such as aggression, self-affirmation, social dominance, and a lack of consideration for others.”* I also saw in a “male fitness” website that, *“toxic masculinity” is a collection of harmful beliefs, tendencies, and behaviors rooted in traditional male roles.*

Woke, DEI, gender bending pronouns, whatever men can do women can do better, etc., it goes on and on. Men have been denounced as useless on shows such as the VIEW, and other media or venues. Toxic Masculinity? The only thing toxic in all of this is the full-on attack on the traditional male. Make no mistake, it is an attack designed to not only diminish traditional men, but the traditional family unit as well; the fundamental building block of our society.

This letter is for the young men who will hopefully someday experience fatherhood. It is for the fathers and grandfathers, who know well of what I speak. It is for the women who understand and love their man, putting up with their fallibilities, supporting them come what may, and in the process, bring out the best of what they have to offer. It is for those who may have doubts or are confused.

America’s greatness is largely due to the traditional male, testosterone and all. The men who came to the new-world, were no longer constrained by the old-world caste system. Unleashed, they showed greatness throughout American history. It was men who carved out the first settlements in the wilderness, seeking to determine their own course in life. To help secure our independence, it was men that crossed the Delaware River on that freezing December night to attack the Hessians, and men who survived that winter in Valley Forge. It was men who framed the founding documents and made us one nation under God. It was men, supported by history’s strongest women, who wrought a nation out of harsh wilderness and won the west.

It was men that built the 20th century skyscrapers, and launched thousands of ships so that America could determine its own destiny. It was men who dug canals, invented steamboats, developed railway systems and built an interstate highway system that is the envy of the world. It was men who stormed the beaches of Normandy in 1944, and took Mount Suribachi in 1945. It was a man who set the national goal of going to the moon in 1961, and primarily men who achieved the impossible dream just 8 years later, when the nation watched men walk on the moon. By the way we watched that piece of history in the comfort of our homes by means of another American man-made invention, the television. It was men who fathered and kept safe the American family. Yes, the American family, small, hardly noticeable in the big scheme of things, but without doubt the greatest contribution to American greatness.

It is men who built our society, and it is men who by in large keep it running. How long would America survive if those toxic traditional men were removed from let’s say, construction, oil rigs, mining, timber industry, utility linemen, commercial fishermen, firefighting, law enforcement, farming, mechanics, or the military? According to the World Economic Forum, as of 2022, 83% of all new patents on inventions are held by men. Let’s take it a step further; how long would our nation survive if we remove men from the equation of the traditional family?

Mistakes? Plenty. It was men who developed slavery thousands of years ago. Most societies have practiced it, some still do. Slavery darkened a significant part of American history; but it was men who finally ended it with a civil war that cost the lives of 620,000 men. There may have been a better way, but we needed to correct that to move on as a nation.

To condemn men on the whole for being “masculine”, a God-given trait, well it is a false doctrine, and seeks to undermine a role critical to the success of our society, and of the family. Men and women were created by God with very specific skill sets and traits. We complement each other, complete each other. We are not, nor have ever been in competition. The dark forces that seek to belittle and change this divine plan is not of God.

As Father’s Day is coming soon, let’s stay with that. What is fatherhood all about anyway? Let’s put it in the form of some questions. Within the answers to these questions lie the truth that real men know, and try their best to live up to.

Who is the strongest? The man who gives everything he has, each and every day, even when he is hurt or sick, and makes light of his trouble.

Who is toughest? The man who stands back up when he is knocked down, and continues on...over, and over, and over, until his end, when he can stand up no more.

Who is brave? The man who can look at probable defeat, and still move ahead with what he has, doing the very best he can, showing no trepidation or fear.

Who is the greatest? The man who is humble and understands that he serves others by protecting, providing, teaching, mentoring and setting the example for others.

Who is the wisest? The man who puts his own desires and ambitions aside, and seeks to build up others in unity.
