A Prayer When You Don’t Know What to Do - Your Daily Prayer

Paralyzed in action, but still able to launch a [prayer](#) – I paced the hallways in the morning, sought God in my quiet time, and asked for direction in the night. I uttered the prayer, “What do you want me to do, God?”

“Do you want me to do this... or do you want me to do that...?”

Silence.

“Again, Father, I don’t know what to do.”

Nothing.

Later, “Help, Father.”

No answer.

What do we do when we want to do His will, but we still don’t know – entirely – what it is?

It’s aggravating, isn’t it? Infuriating at times, I admit.

Sometimes, I want so much *to know* that I don’t know how *to go*.

I get all balled up in stress trying to make the right choice. I want to pick perfectly. Sure, I don’t want to strive, yet I want a meaningful life. And maybe there’s too much of a me-focus in all this. Too much emphasis on my own decision-making timeline. And perhaps this is why God isn’t answering.

Do you feel the pressure of making a decision, like I do? Do you place hard, time-oriented demands on the process of knowing?

Last night, I lay in bed, and the thought hit me, “What if God cares more about *how* my heart is postured than *what* I do for Him?”

That was a thought!

Love is paramount, after all! Love never fails, scripture says ([1 Cor. 13:8](#)).

What if the answer to what to do, how to move, and what it looks like to proceed is actually love? Love Him. Love them. Love the wait. Love His Word. Love myself as I discern God’s leading.

Rather than hating the wait, I can choose patience in the process and loving kindness towards myself as I proceed on God’s timeline. Instead of distress, I delight myself in the Lord.

*Won’t He work out the gap? Won’t He provide the answer? Won’t He come through?*

I trust God when I wait well.

Waiting well looks like avoiding distress and enduring in love.

[1 Corinthians 16:14](#) says, “Do everything in love.”

When decisions have to be made, we can ask ourselves, “Will this produce more love in my life – toward God, myself, and others – or will it reduce love?”

Here, we can do all things, including making decisions, in love.

Let’s Pray:

Father, I need help with the direction I should take. I don’t know what to do, but I know I want to do it with You. I know I want to go Your way. Will you lead me? Will you guide me? Will you instruct me in the way I should go? Will you lead me on Your paths of love?

[Jesus](#), You are The Way. I ask you to illuminate my paths so that I can see the light of Your glory. You are my everything, and I want to stay with You. I want to be where Your plans are. I love You.

## To Be a Saint – Liturgical Cycles and Seasons

We spend much time contemplating the passing of the seasons and their meaning. We do so in the context of the Gregorian calendar we're all familiar with. On it is marked the seasons, Autumn, Spring, Summer and Fall, along with the holidays. But there is another calendar quietly played out through the year. It is the Church's liturgical calendar. The calendar in the west differs somewhat then the east, but each one is beautifully played out according to their respective traditions.

Both traditions have their roots in Judaism. Jews celebrated feasts such as Passover Pentecost and Tabernacles, remembering God's interactions with mankind. Within the Gospels we read of Jesus participating in these celebrations. It was Jesus though that gave them new meaning within the fulfillment of scripture. Thus, Jewish feasts became the basis of many of our Catholic feasts, and the church's liturgical calendar was developed around them.

The beginning of the Roman Catholic year commences on the first Sunday of Advent, and concludes with the Feast of Christ the King. A yearly cycle that begins with the anticipation of the coming of Christ, and ends with the celebration as Christ as the Sovereign King of all creation. The Roman Church organizes its liturgical year into three-year cycles of readings known as cycle A, B, and C, focused on the synoptic Gospels. Cycle A focuses on the Gospel of Matthew, which presents Jesus as the looked-for Messiah, fulfilling the Old Testament prophecies. Cycle B takes the Gospel of Mark, and presents Jesus as the suffering servant who comes to serve mankind and invites us to contemplate His humanity. Cycle C centers on the Gospel of Luke and emphasizes the mercy of Jesus and His care for the poor, marginalized and sinners. Luke presents Jesus as a universal Savior to all people. The Gospel of John is there each year during special occasions and the Easter season.

Apart from these three cycles, the Roman Catholic church divides the year into six seasons, Advent, Christmas, Lent, the Sacred Paschal Triduum, Easter and Ordinary time. Advent is a time for waiting and preparation. Christmas of course celebrates the birth of our Savior. Lent is a time for self-examination and preparation to walk with Christ toward Calvary. The Sacred Paschal Triduum is the culmination of lent, and is commonly called Holy Week, with Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday forming the main. Easter of course is the Resurrection and the opening of the gates of heaven for mankind. Easter season extends until Pentecost when the promised paraclete descends upon the disciples and the Catholic Church is born. The sixth season, called ordinary time, is the longest of the liturgical seasons. It is a time to grow spiritually in the life of Christ, to meditate on the Life of Jesus and His teachings, and live as His disciples.

We turn now to the Eastern Catholic Church. The Roman Empire held what was called "Indiction", a period of taxation, commencing on September 1st. Eastern Christians decided

early on to begin their liturgical year on this same date each year. There is also the tradition that the first of September marked the victory of Emperor Constantine the Great in AD312 over the pagan Roman Emperor, which ultimately led to the end of the Christian persecution, and adoption of Christianity within the Empire. This date was then confirmed by the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea in AD325. Eastern Christians have also assigned various biblical events to September 1st. For example, it is believed that Jesus marked the beginning of his public ministry following the beheading of St. John the Baptist, which according to tradition occurred on August 29. Thus, John the Baptist's death closed the book on the Old Testament and the New Testament immediately began with Christ's public ministry.

Tradition varies with each of the Eastern Rites. In the Byzantine Rite, the liturgical year becomes the manifestation of Jesus Christ and His mysteries, unfolding independently of the calendar yet coinciding with it. Within this develops a cycle, including the Paschal cycle of moveable feast days, and the Sanctoral cycle of immoveable feast days. Each cycle is subdivided into liturgical periods (weeks). Each Sunday and weekday commemorates an event from the life of Christ or His mother or is dedicated to the memory of a Saint. Within this we find feast days, pre-festive and post-festive periods and days of fast.

Forgive my clumsy treatment of this topic. The subject, developed over centuries of tradition, is a topic better addressed in volumes rather than one of these short letters. Ultimately the Church year and its various cycles and seasons become a guide for our salvation in Jesus Christ. There is deep meaning in it all. If you want to enrich your life and come closer to your Savior, take the time to understand it. Embrace it.
