To Be a Saint – Who Am I?

Who am I? This is a question that nearly everyone of us asks at some point in their life. Some ask it early; others ask it a bit late. Still others ask it frequently, especially during difficult or trying circumstances. I fall into this last category.

Who am I? Some would say it is a useless question from someone who does not know themselves, or are weak minded. Yet it is a question many have asked, including Socrates, Saint Thomas Aquinas, Leonardo DaVinci and Mahatma Gahndi. For me it is a grounding question used as an anchor during stressful situations, when I need stability, when I need to separate fact from fear. Practiced over time, it becomes an automatic process that functions as a moral compass. It re-affirms values, and cultivates virtue. The answer removes self-doubt and shifts the focus from chaos and confusion to one of resolute action, for in answering the question we step back from societal expectations, and focus on core values. It can also help to keep us better aligned with God.

“ I praise You for I am fearfully and wonderfully made ” Ps. 139: 14

God created us in His image, and we are unique to all other creatures on earth. Each of us has gifts and talents that are meant to be used to serve a purpose. The grounding question of “Who am I?” refocuses us on that. It keeps us aligned with God’s purpose. For Aquinas, the answer to “Who am I?”, is not something we invent or fully grasp on our own. Instead, it is a life-long process to understand ourselves in relationship to God and God’s Will. So accordingly, we pose this question to ourselves throughout life, as we come to understand ourselves through experience and God’s grace.

Be careful; for in answering the question “Who am I?”, we are not seeking self-justification. We are masters of self-justification, rationalizing our actions to fit the situation. Self-justification causes us to misjudge our abilities, distorts our values and leads to bad decisions; in some cases, a lifetime of bad decisions. Self-justification tries to shift blame or reinterpret events. This in turn leads to repeated mistakes, missed opportunities and ruins relationships. In asking the question “Who am I?”, you want a clean answer, not one clouded with fallacy.

Yes there are other pitfalls, most of them have to do with pride and vanity. If you can filter them out, keep the assessment clean and pure, you will discover a hidden strength. You will be able to stand back up when you’re knocked down. You will be clear minded when others are confused and intimidated.

“Who am I?”, is a question that is relevant more than ever today. We live in a fast moving, complex world. It was not always so. Technology advance slowly through much of history. Our advances came about in terms of “ages”, which covered many centuries, with names like stone age, bronze age, iron age and so forth. Starting with the industrial revolution however, technology began advancing quickly, and in major leaps unrealized in antiquity. Consider that from the time of the first human flight to man walking on the moon was only 66

years. Computers, big bulky things first developed in the 1930s and 40s, are now carried with us daily in our side pocket, and with that comes instant access to global knowledge. Past generations, say in the 12th and 13th century, would be able to adapt quickly if placed in the 14th and 15th century. That would not be the case today. If people living in the 19th century were suddenly placed in the 21st century, imagine their distress. Innovation is moving faster than our applied ethical, moral, and philosophical understanding can keep up with. At the same time, our relationship and understanding of God has declined significantly.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is the next major technological advance, and it has the potential to change our very existence. We will need a strong moral compass to deal with the issues AI brings about. Within AI we are developing systems that reflect our priorities, our values, and behaviors. They will mirror our human strengths and also our human prejudices and fallacies. How will we develop AI with the God-given gifts of love, empathy, moral judgment, courage and sense of self-sacrifice? On the other hand, what happens if we inadvertently lead AI to mimic self-justification, greed, envy and wrath? We are playing with a force that requires a deep understanding of the question “Who am I?” and within that, our relationship to God.

If not, then the servant will become the master.
