10 Soul-Centered Things to Give Up for Lent (That Aren't Food)

What if fasting this Lent actually transformed your habits, not just your diet? These 10 soul-deep shifts can clear out what is draining you and make space for freedom, peace, and a closer walk with God.

4. Give up holding grudges.

SLIDE 4 OF 10

Unforgiveness poisons our souls with bitterness. It keeps old wounds open and often harms us more than the person who hurt us. While forgiveness is rarely easy, the Bible teaches that forgiving people who have hurt us is something we must do, with God's help, to be spiritually free. [Colossians 3:13](#) encourages us to: "Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." God's forgiveness of us becomes the foundation for our forgiveness of others. Giving up grudges during [Lent](#) doesn't mean denying our pain or pretending that our trust is restored instantly. It just means choosing to release bitterness and [trusting God to bring justice to unjust situations](#). [Romans 12:19](#) reminds us that vengeance belongs to the Lord. This fast may challenge us to repeatedly pray, reflect, and surrender as God helps us let go of grudges and move forward. Over time, the forgiveness process will soften our hearts and create space for us to heal and experience peace.

5. Give up trying to control.

SLIDE 5 OF 10

While it's important to be responsible, trying to control situations in our lives is spiritually dangerous because it makes it hard for us to trust in God (the One who's really in control). [Proverbs 3:5-6](#) encourages us to: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding" ([Proverbs 3:5-6](#)). We can fast from trying to control our lives by practicing surrender, especially in situations where we're especially concerned about the uncertainty we face.

During [Lent](#), we can notice when we start worrying about a situation, and then immediately [turn our worries into prayers](#) by surrendering those concerns to God and praying for his best to happen. It can be challenging to practice surrender, but the more we fast from trying to control the outcomes of situations we face, the more we can enjoy peace and discover God's faithfulness as he answers our prayers.

6. Give up gossip and unnecessary criticism.

SLIDE 6 OF 10

We may not think we gossip about people, but we need to be careful, because we can end up gossiping if we talk about others without boundaries that protect their privacy while we're expressing concern for them or venting about them to relieve stress. [Proverbs 16:28](#) warns about the destructive power of gossiping: "A gossip separates close friends" ([Proverbs 16:28](#)), and careless words can erode trust and unity in relationships. During [Lent](#), we can examine not just what we say, but why we say it. Are we speaking to feel included, superior, or entertained? Or are our words shaped by love and truth?

[Ephesians 4:29](#) gives us a helpful filter: "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up." We don't need to avoid difficult conversations. But we should [exercise discernment](#) when we talk about other people. As we fast from gossip, we can practice replacing it with [prayer](#). When we're tempted to criticize someone, we can pause and pray for that person instead. This will help us change both our words and our hearts for the better.

Our Daily Bread – Who Took That Water?

We live in times where negativity abound, seemingly divided as a nation, split along political lines, racial lines, religious lines, and so on. Some can find fault in everything. You have heard of the optimism vs. pessimism test? You know, the one which asks you if a glass of water is half full or half empty? Well among those on the half empty side is a growing crowd that feel it is not only half empty, they want to know who took that water, and what are we doing to get it back.....

Media, entertainment, our leaders, the pressures of daily life, we all know the list of causes. Sometimes we don't need an excuse, we just like to gripe. We may be the land of the free but we are seemingly a long way from being the land of the contented.

Where is the inspiration that takes our minds off the negative. Where is the story of overcoming the odds and making a positive difference. There out there. They must be. We sometimes just can't see them or maybe, on occasion, just ignore them. Let's take a look...

His name is Richard Pulley from Manchester, Tennessee. Richard, an elderly door-dash driver, was spied on video struggling up to the steps of a house, almost falling off the porch, to deliver an order of Starbucks coffee. He made the delivery and walked ever-so painfully back to his car for his next delivery. The owner of the house watched the video and wanted to know more about this man who barely could walk, and was in a job that clearly required a much younger person. In time she tracked Richard down. He was still out making his deliveries, uncomplaining. He told her he was thrown back into the work force because his wife had lost her job, and with it their health insurance. They needed the extra income to survive. A sad story, but Richard didn't throw in the towel. He took the first work that came to him and was making the best of it. He was holding onto his wife, his home and their independence the best he could; all that mattered in his world. There's a nobility in that, and its uniquely American. But wait the story gets better.

The lady who owned the house and saw Richard's delivery is Brittany Smith. After finding out the details she organized a Go-Fund-Me to help Richard and his wife. To date it has raised over \$500,000. The open-handed generosity of this story stands in sharp contrast to the constant negativity we are subjected to.

The inspiration is out there; in fact, it surrounds us. I could point out other examples, those not in the news but experienced in daily life. Things that inspire, things that motivate.

Have you ever been to a game where the spectators sang the National Anthem without accompanying music? Remember the emotion and the chills you got from it? For a moment, while we were singing, we were all one; that's patriotism. Have you ever held the hand of someone close to death and prayed with them as they slipped away; that's love. It's spontaneous, done without the intent to inspire others, but for those watching it is a strong motivator.

When a fireman goes into a burning building to save a life, or when the medic fights with all his skill to save a patient in route to the hospital, it should inspire us. When a class stands to recite the Pledge of Allegiance or can recite the preamble to the Constitution, that should lift our spirits. When a complete stranger looks behind him at the cash register and finds a mother of four searching through her wallet to find milk money; then hands the cashier a \$20 bill, enough to cover her tab and a little more, then walks out without drawing attention. That is the America I live in. Yes, inspiration is all around us. It is found when a husband and wife spends what little they have saved up to put their kids through school, to give them an opportunity they never had. Or when a family gathers around the supper table to pray, and then takes the time during the meal to rejoice in all they have in each other, and not dwell on what they don't have. There is strength in this.

We will always have the bad news bears among us; you know, the ones trying to find out who stole the half a glass of water. Focus on the water that's in your glass; build your life around it. You will find its more than enough to satisfy.
